Attitudes Toward People and Organizations

- **Planned Parenthood maintains strong favorability in Alaska.** Fifty-eight (58) percent are favorable toward the organization, including more than a third who are very favorable (37%).
- Voters who are most favorable toward Planned Parenthood include women, younger voters, Democrats, pro-choice voters, voters in Anchorage, and non-parents.
- Few are favorable toward Congress or the Alaskan State Legislature (-26 and -23 net unfavorable, respectively).

Attitudes Toward Abortion and Birth Control

- Despite being a majority Republican state, Alaska is a solidly pro-choice state with 59% saying they are pro-choice, including 34% of Republicans.
- Nearly 8-in-10 Alaskans do not want to see laws passed that ban abortion in the state legislature.
- Fifty-eight (58) percent of Alaskans think it is very important for women in the state to have access to all of the reproductive health care options available, including abortion. With the exception of anti-choice voters, at least half of all subgroups believe it is important.
- An even stronger majority of Alaskans think it is important for there to be access to birth control for everyone who wants it or needs it (83% important, 67% very important). This included two-thirds of anti-choice voters and more than 7-in-10 Republicans. Every subgroup sees this as net-important.

State Legislation

- Six-in-ten Alaskans would be less likely to support their state legislator if he or she supported the Governor's vetoes to cut Medicaid, education, and the courts. With nearly half much less likely (49%), only Republican voters are net-likely to support their state legislator. Anti-choice voters are split.
 - Democratic men (84%), Democrats (81%), pro-choice Alaskans (64%), and college women (57%) are most likely to respond they would be much less likely to support their state legislator.
- More than three-quarters (76%) of Alaska voters support a bill that guarantees protections in employment, housing, and public accommodations regardless of a person's sexual orientation or gender identity and nearly two-thirds (65%) strongly support it.
 - Women (82%), Democrats (96%), and pro-choice voters (85%) are most likely to support the bill. A solid majority across gender, age, race, partisanship, region, and choice stance all support it.

Attitudes Toward Sex Education

• We consider strong statements to meet a certain threshold: 60% agree, 40% strongly agree. The top tier of statements around sex education far surpass this threshold, especially those focused on sex

education being medically accurate, age-appropriate, and helping young people understand healthy relationships and communication skills.

- Young people need to understand what a healthy relationship looks like and have the opportunity to practice good communication skills before they become sexually active 95% agree, 85% strongly
- Sex education should be medically accurate 93% agree, 86% strongly
- Sex education should be age-appropriate 92% agree, 83% strongly
- We should require sex education that covers healthy relationships, consent, and communication skills 90% agree, 81% strongly
